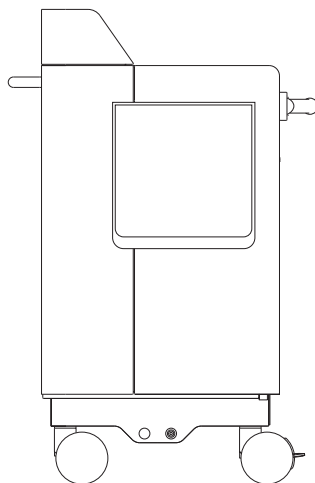
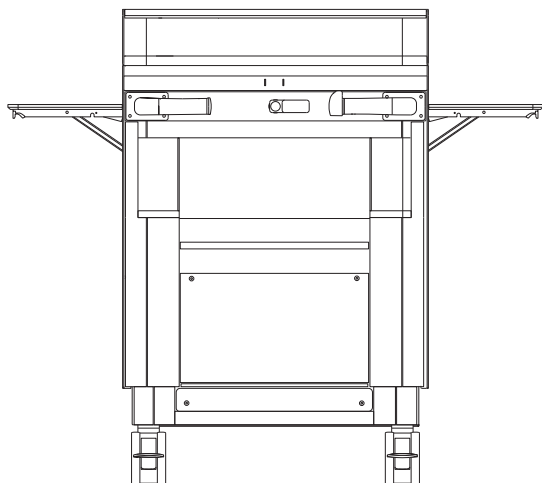


SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Air.Go Assistant Light

A Multipurpose, Mobile Servicedesk



INFORMATION

These safety instructions contain important information for safe use

They must be read and understood before operating the unit.

This document supplements the "Instructions for Use" and must be kept with the unit at all times.

1. GENERAL SAFETY INFORMATION

1.1 Stability and movement

The Air.Go Assistant Light is a height-adjustable mobile workstation, intended for professional indoor use in airport environments.

Failure to follow these safety instructions may result in personal injury, damage to the unit or damage to surrounding property.

Only trained users who have read the "Instructions for Use" are permitted to operate the unit.

The unit must not be modified or used for purposes other than those described by the manufacturer.

1.2 Food and beverages

Food and beverages must not be placed on or near the unit. Liquids may damage electrical components and create a safety hazard.

2. INTENDED USE AND MISUSE

2.1 Intended use

The unit is intended for use as a mobile service and check-in workstation.

2.2 Foreseeable misuse

The unit must not be used:

- As a means of transport for persons or goods
- On slopes exceeding 5°
- On uneven or unstable surfaces
- Outdoors or in wet environments
- In explosive or flammable atmospheres

3. STABILITY AND MOVEMENT

3.2 Driving on slopes

The unit may be moved on ramps with a maximum slope of 5°.

- Never move on steeper ramps

- Never move on uneven or unstable ground
- Always move straight up or down the slope
- Do not move laterally across a sloping surface, as this may cause tipping
- Never leave the unit unattended on slopes or near edges.

3.1 Safe operation

Before movement, always lower the unit to the lowest possible working height to minimise the risk of tipping.

Always maintain full control of the unit while moving.

The unit must not be used to transport persons or additional loads.

4. HEIGHT ADJUSTMENT

4.1 General precautions

The unit is equipped with an electrically operated height adjustment system.

When adjusting the height:

- Keep hands, fingers and clothing away from the moving column and surrounding gaps
 - Ensure that no persons or objects are positioned near moving parts
 - Do not adjust the height while leaning on the unit
 - Stop operation immediately if unusual resistance or noise occurs
- Improper use may result in crushing or pinching injuries.

5. MOVING PARTS AND PINCH HAZARDS

5.1 General pinch hazards

The Air.Go Assistant Light contains moving parts, including the monitor arm, drawers and service panels.

There is a risk of crushing or pinching

during operation.

- Keep hands and fingers clear of hinges, joints and sliding components
- Take special care when opening, closing or adjusting any movable parts
- Do not place objects in areas where moving parts may close or slide

5.2 Fold-out side table

The unit includes a fold-out side table. Keep hands and fingers clear when opening and closing the table. Ensure the table is empty before folding it down. Maximum load: 10 kg.

6. ELECTRICAL SAFETY

6.1 Electrical safety

The unit must only be connected to a properly grounded mains outlet. Power outlets (max. 400W total) may only be used for operator equipment intended for use with the unit. Connection of extension cords or high-power electrical devices is not permitted.

6.2 Cable routing

Cables must be routed and secured to prevent tripping hazards and must not interfere with moving parts.

6.3 Indoor use only

The unit is intended for indoor use only and must not be exposed to rain or moisture.

7. PUBLIC USE, UNATHORISED USE AND INSPECTION

7.1 Operation in public areas

When operating the unit in public areas, ensure sufficient distance to passengers and other persons at all times. Extra caution must be taken in crowded environments.

7.2 Unauthorized use

The unit must not be operated by children or unauthorized personnel. The unit is not a toy.

7.3 Inspection and maintenance

The unit must undergo an annual safety inspection as described in the Instructions for Use. Any safety-related defects must be corrected before the unit is returned to operation.

Failure to carry out and document the annual safety inspection may affect the unit's continued conformity with applicable safety and CE requirements.

The inspection must be documented and retained as part of the unit's safety records.
